TERRITORY: Social environment: humanized area. Population: distribution, structure and main problems. Urban space: structure and evolution of the city and urban systems. Rural areas: elements and factors of agricultural landscapes. World agricultural types.

PHILOSOPHY: The forms of human thought. Contemporary philosophical thought. The projection of the world of thought about reality. Conceptions of man and the universe from the world of beliefs. The influence of science and technology in human evolution
